Dear Parents and Carers,

At Westacre Infant School, we believe learning that takes place at home is as an opportunity for children, parents, carers and teachers to build a shared responsibility for learning.

We believe it can:

- enable children to consolidate and reinforce their skills and understanding
- build an effective partnership between home and school
- enable parents and carers to be involved in their child's education

We want the work that the children do at home to be useful and not too onerous. The most important thing you can do is to hear your children read regularly and expose them to books that they can't read but are interested in.

As you know, throughout the year we have been sending home notifications of our Westacre Warm Ups. We believe that where children are completing these, it is having a positive impact on their confidence and progress in the lessons.

In Reception we make reference to a weekly document that is on our website for you to see. It may include Education City activities and other learning that the Reception Staff have identified as being useful for the following week.

In Year 1, we will again make reference to a document on the website that gives you the opportunity to work with your children on relevant knowledge and skills over a 2 week period.

In Year 2, the teachers have specifically identified Education City activities that your children need to complete to help them before hand or to use for consolidation afterwards. All of the above options will give you an your children a real insight into what they are learning.

In addition to this, we are asking parents and carers to continue supporting your children with the half termly homework projects. We use the projects that are created for displays

that showcase the children's creativity around the school. The children love to see share their creations in school and see them on display.
