This half term we will have lot's of fun enjoying new experiences. Developing our love for learning. We will become confident and inspired in our learning and understand the value of working together to create some wonderful things.

DT

In Design and technology we will be designing and creating our own animal puppets.

Key Skills:

Design purposeful functional and appealing products for themselves based on design criteria.

SCIENCE

As Scientists we will be exploring Animals including their habitats, where they live and classifying them into types and carnivores omnivores and herbivores.

Key Skills:

Identify, name and describe a variety of different types of animals including sorting animals into groups.



ENGLISH

Writing

As writers we will be looking at fantasy stories such as 'Elmer Stories' by David McKee. Children will be learning to use suffixes, develop our sentences writing by using capital letters and full stops fluently. We will also focus on handwriting and presentation, writing clearly on the line using ascenders and descenders.

Reading

As readers in guided reading, we will be developing our inference skills. We will be working on becoming fluent readers and using expression appropriately.

MATHS

As Mathematicians we will be covering 2D and 3D shapes naming and describing them and looking at their properties. We will learn about Arrays (counting in groups) and halves and doubles. We will also be consolidating our number recognition to 50 and beyond.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

We will be looking at dance and multi skills. As well as working with Soccer 2000.

Key Skills:

Master basic movements, including, running , jumping, throwing and catching.



MUSIC

Your Imagination.

In Music we will be focusing on steady beat/ pulse and singing techniques. We will use glockenspiels to accompany our performances.

Key Skills:

Using our bodies, Glockenspiels and our voices to improvise and perform.



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Sikhism

In R.E. we will be learning about the Sikh faith. Including the 5Ks. The Sikh place of worships and their traditions.

Key Skills:

Identify the importance of religion and faith.



ART

As Artists we will be studying sculpture looking local art and artists including Barbara Hepworth. We will be creating our own sculptures using clay. Looking at detail, pattern and texture.

Key Skills:

To use clay to sculpt in order to develop and share their ideas.
